Cheerleading

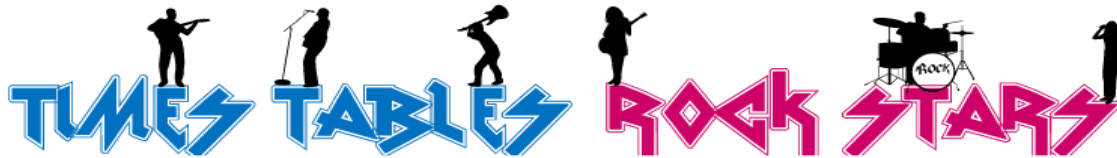

Study Bugs


We are pleased to announce that St Michael's is taking part in an initiative with Studybugs who are working in partnership with the NHS to analyse the spread of illness and asthma in the region. We are trialling a new way to report your child's absence due to illness, which will provide you with NHS advice on treatment and guidance as to whether your child should be in school or kept at home.


If you haven't already got it, please download the free Studybugs app, or register on the Studybugs website, and use it to tell us whenever your child is ill and unable to attend school. Please note that you will still be able to inform us in the normal way via email or phone call to the office, if this is preferable.
