We received confirmation on Tuesday that Galleywood Library, which had been earmarked for closure, will not close after all! Following a consultation period which galvanised love and support for our libraries, Essex County Council announced a U-turn: no libraries will be closing for at least the next five years! The devil will be in the detail as we await full confirmation of exactly what the future proposals are for our valuable local resource; next Monday County Hall will publish its final libraries strategy for approval at Cabinet on July 23rd. So, watch this space but people power seems to have won the day! Well done to all our pupils who have been so passionate in expressing their views about the proposals and who have protested on more than one occasion in a mature and controlled way. ### **SATs results**

On Tuesday, we received the SATs results for our Year Six pupils. I am delighted to report that we are above national average in all disciplines – reading, writing, grammar and maths. We are particularly pleased with the percentage of children who have achieved at the higher level – our results at this standard are way above the national average. Well done to Year Six for all of their hard work and for all of the teachers and LSAs who worked with these children since Year Three.

### **Class Swap Afternoon**

On Monday afternoon, the children spent the afternoon with their new teachers for next year.
