### **Safeguarding Monkey**

Our online safety experts have been alerted to an extremely dangerous website and app called 'Monkey', which allows users to have video calls with strangers. The platform markets itself as 'an alternative to Omegle, with a TikTok vibe'. Our online safety experts reviewed and tested this platform and have found that it contains large amounts of inappropriate, disturbing, and harmful content transmitted via web cameras.

#### **What is Monkey?**

- Monkey is an online video chat service that is like Omegle or Chat Roulette, with a TikTok style interface.
- Users can talk to strangers from all over the world via webcam.
- Once a conversation is finished, or one user wishes to leave the conversation or talk to someone else, they click 'next' and are presented with a new user who could be from anywhere in the world.
- Users are asked to select their gender before meeting people.

#### **Age Rating:**

- The website states that all users must be over 18, but there is zero age verification. Users only must tick a box to confirm that they are over 18. Google Play Age Rating: Parental Guidance.

The app is currently only available on Android devices.

### **Parent Voice – 20<sup>th</sup> October 2021 at 9.45am**

I would like to invite parents to the first Parent Voice session. This will give parents an opportunity to informally meet with me, in the hall, to chat about a particular school matter whilst enjoying a cup of tea and biscuit! The matter we will be discussing at this meeting is regarding school communication with parents and what systems we currently use to communicate with parents and which ones you find most useful. If you are unable to attend, but would still like your voice heard, I will be sending a Google Form home for you to comment on the current communication systems that we use and to gather your thoughts.

### **Open Afternoon**

We would like to start to invite parents back into school and would like to start by inviting **Year 3 parents** to an open afternoon from **2.30pm – 3.20pm on Monday 27<sup>th</sup> September**. Parents are welcome to join their children in their classrooms and to work with them, familiarise themselves with the classroom and the children's environment at St Michaels. Please arrive at the front office at 2.30pm to sign in.

From 3.20pm on the same day, we would like to ask **all other year group parents** to come and meet their child's new class teacher and to spend time in the classroom. We will open the school from **3.20pm – 4.30pm** on this occasion. Please meet your child at 3.20pm on the front playground and enter your child's classroom from there.

Year 6 children will be at Aylmerton that week so we will organise another opportunity for year 6 parents to visit school.

Mrs Bowcher will be working at St Michael's on a Thursday and Friday and will be teaching and working with groups of children across years 3 and 4.

### **Bike Shed**

Mr Jonathan very kindly 'spruced up' our bike shed during the summer holidays by repainting it. Bikes and scooters can now be brought to school if parents are satisfied that their child is safe to travel to school in this way.

For safety reasons, children must dismount from their bike or scooter before entering the school grounds and not ride their bike or scooter until out of the school grounds at the end of the day. All children must wear a helmet if riding a scooter or bike to school and the children are responsible for the safe keeping of this in their classroom.

Even though we do lock the gate next to the bike shed, the school cannot be responsible for the safekeeping of bicycles so please ensure your own insurance covers any losses.

***For the safety of all the pupils and parents on the front playground, please can parents ensure that younger siblings are not riding their bikes or scooters at the beginning or end of day.***

We are extremely lucky to have a Woodland area at St Michael's which sits just behind the bike shed. All the planned attempts to clear this and the surrounding area have always been delayed owing to Covid-19 restrictions however, as the restrictions lift and as we turn our attention to Forest School starting again after the October half term, we are hoping that you can help the school clear the site, it is very overgrown!

I am asking if there are any willing parent volunteers who would be prepared to give up any spare time on Saturday 25<sup>th</sup> September to help me clear the site. I do appreciate that your time is precious and that parents are busy people so I would appreciate any help that you would be prepared to offer. Rather than a morning and afternoon session, I am suggesting two morning sessions: 9.30 – 11.00am and 11.00am – 12.30pm.
