## St Michael's CofE (VA) Junior School - Contingency Plan for Remote Learning (Covid-19)

1. Remote education support: Where a group or small number of pupils need to self-isolate, schools will offer remote education. Schools are expected to consider how to continue to improve the quality of their existing offer and have a strong contingency plan in place for remote education provision. Engagement in home learning is compulsory to ensure that learning time is not lost.

## 2. St Michael's will:

- use a curriculum sequence that allows access to high-quality online and, at times, offline resources and that are linked to the school's curriculum objectives and expectations
- give access to high quality remote education resources
- select the online tools that will be consistently used across the school to allow interaction, assessment and feedback
- provide printed resources if pupils do not have suitable online access
- deliver a broad and ambitious curriculum and recognise that younger pupils and some pupils with SEND may not be able to access remote education without adult support. Teachers will signpost children to differentiated activities, when needed.

## 3. When teaching pupils remotely, St Michael's will:

- set activities so that pupils have meaningful and ambitious work each day in several different subjects (Purple Mash/Oak National Academy)
- provide a planned and well-sequenced curriculum so that knowledge and skills are built incrementally, with a good level of clarity about what is intended to be practised in each subject
- provide high-quality curriculum resources (Oak National Academy, Bitesize)
- plan a programme that is of equivalent length to the core teaching pupils would receive in school
