The children will need their PE kit, a sun hat, a water bottle and, if possible, a coloured T-shirt in their house colour (St George: Red, St David: Yellow, St Andrew: Blue, St Patrick: Green). Sun cream should be applied before they come to school.

Parents and adults can attend Sports Day. Adults will be welcome in school from 12.00am onwards on the 13th July. There will be a picnic lunch on the school field from 12:00am which you are welcome to bring and enjoy with your child. Please feel free to bring along a picnic blanket, chairs and umbrella if you wish. Please note that if your child normally has a school dinner, this will still be provided if required and if you are not able to attend, your child will sit with their classmates to enjoy the picnic. When packing for the picnic lunch, please remember that we are a nut aware school.

Please note – after the children have eaten their lunch they can play on the school field or the playground, the Gym Trails and exercise equipment will be out of bounds that day. Can we remind you that any younger siblings do need to be under your close supervision.

At the end of lunchtime, children will return to their classes for afternoon register. During this time, please make your way over to the marked out area on the near side of the running track. The children will then make their way on to the field and over to the far side of the running track in the care of their teachers. During the running of the event, please remain in the marked area and do not cross over the track to the children's area. Events will commence from 1.15pm. Please note that chairs will not be set out on the field for spectators. Once all the events have been completed, the children will return to class with their teachers and will leave the school via the front playground as usual.


